Background Information

- Elder abuse and violence remains a growing problem across all EU regions.
- It is a worldwide concern that touches on human rights and gender equality
- Due to the ageing population, the extent of elder abuse can be expected to grow with it.
- Whilst this is the case, there remains a lack of data, evidence and work in the area
- As a result, the ageing population and safety of the older persons bring challenges for social and health care services and professionals
- Social and health care workers are in the key position to recognise and support older victims way for both parties. of abuse yet there needs to be a more effective system in place to recognize victims in a safe



The main issues identified include:

- Lack of experience and knowledge in the area of elder abuse, how to identify characteristics of abuse, the prevalence of such and how to support victims.
- There is lack of guidance at national level
- Access to relevant training programmes is lacking due to time constraints and funding


