Agenda:

Safe shelter for elderly women in life dangerous situations

Functioning crises intervention in cases of violence

Ensure safe shelter for elderly women as currently some municipalities offer shelter for mothers with small children, but there is no anonymous shelter and nothing for elderly women.

MARTA Centre informs about work that is done with private sector to ensure safe place for elderly women as there is no support from either Ministry of Welfare or Riga City Council. MARTA representatives also inform about focus group results that were held with elderly women and their needs.

Riga City Council tells about limitations and difficulties to offer support for elderly women and turns to the Ministry of Welfare representatives that clarifies that they provide rehabilitation programme.

MARTA Centre clarifies the aspects and difficulties of the state programme that does not take into consideration the aspects of life dangerous situations at home, inefficiency of the police to react, women's fear to turn against their perpetrators but their need to receive qualitative support and safe place to stay.

The discussion goes on about possible crises intervention programme, that would be functional and based on the real needs of the victim taking into account individual needs of victims of violence. The idea is to create the programme that is similar to the programme that provides support for victims of
